

## The Sainsbury Veterans Welfare Scheme (registered charity number 1125046)

The Welfare Scheme is a charity set up to provide financial support to Veterans who have limited savings (currently less than £22,500) and are in need. Veterans' spouses and partners (as well as surviving spouses and partners) are also eligible to apply for grants.

Although priority is given to these groups, grants may also be available to former Sainsbury's employees who are not Veterans.

Grants of up to £4,000 are available to help with the purchase of essential items that assist with independent living at home.

The most common requests made to the Scheme are for help with the cost of installing walk-in showers or stairlifts, or to purchase rise & recline chairs or beds, mobility scooters or rollators.

Grants are also available for respite care and convalescence when medically recommended.
